Old pupils' dream comes true

The first Grand Reunion Banquet for the expupils of the Residential School for Jewish Deaf Children was held at Seymour Place, London on Sunday, 24th May, 1992.

Having spent some 18 months of fundraising and organising for the Reunion, the committee finally saw their dream come true and were joined by 200 people. Ex-pupils arrived from places as far away as the USA, Canada, Germany, Gibraltar, Israel, South Africa and Yugoslavia, some of whom had not seen each other for 40 years and were overwhelmed to see those who had been childhood friends.

We all had a very enjoyable evening and many good memories were brought back. Our first book to be published, "The History of The RSJDC", was launched. The book contains the entire history of the school from 1885-1965.

Following the banquet on 24th May, the days in the same week were filled with other special events such as a Video Show of the school's old films organised by Harold Fallman and there was a super Archive Exhibition, showing old reproduced photographs and items of school property that were donated by expupils. This was organised by Myer Solomon. There was a Surprise Evening with Israeli folk dancing organised by the Jewish Deaf Circle and a Coach Outing organised by Harold Fallman to Havering House (the place where the children were evacuated to during the war). A Drama Show by the Jewish Deaf Group and the Farewell Barbeque were also held
