1. OPENING REMARKS BY CHAIRMAN.

Martin Bogard declared the Annual Gerenal Meeting opened at 5.10 p.m. 39 members were present.

I have made a statement about Paris Congress this year. I write full details to discuss further information. I have noticed that most members at J.D.A. have not read the various information which I wrote in last years' newletter (November/December). Also many complained about the cost of registration fees which were too dear for them. It is noticed that some people do not belong to Jewish Deaf Circle and J.D.A. I suggest that these are to be supplied with the information of the Club's activities. I know some of them have been criticizing me by thinking that my job was not good enough to catch these peoples' attention. However, W.O.J.D. is not easy.

I joined it last year before March 1991 A.G.M. as Sid Maxwell was unfit and I took his place for the 1992 Paris Congress. That's why I have no past experience for this job. This took time to sort out. The Paris Organiser unfortunately make a mistake by being late in giving us programmes in July last year. It was really quite late and should have been early in January 1991. Most of us did not understand these programmes well. The programmes were poor and it was difficult to understand what was going on. I have heard that the American and Israeli delegates were unhappy with the Paris Organiser because of the poor programmes, detaitls and etc...

As part of my business trip, I went to Paris to meet Patrick Leven (Paris Top Delegate) in October. I found time to discuss various matters with him for him about four hours. When I returned I reported the various information. I was the only one to sort out this information. Also I included these details in the J.D.A. monthly newsletter. The problem was that everything went wrong because some J.D.A. members did not read the newsletter and consequently were misled with this information. Then I gave various pieces of information to the Secretary of the Jewish Deaf Circle in November to remind them about my lecture about W.O.J.D. in November 17th at J.D.A. During the Paris Congress week there will be a French Parade for special events in France with fleets of armies, horses and air force etc... will be shown in the Centre of Paris. You can see all this in the high season during the Paris Congress.

However, that is all I am going to tell you in detail, if you wish to have further information please write to me. Eva Fielding is responsible for accommodation for the group of 25 in the hotel called Camperville. So far we have 19 but need a further six. Please contact either me or Eva urgently.

Myself and the Hearing Committee are delighted with the new magazine and I am sure it will go from strength to strength. We are especially delighted that a committee of members have taken responsibility for it. I would like all the members to know that the Committee's policy as well as my own is for the members to be as independent as they themselves want to be, and we are very happy to co-operate with all their effots.

The Drama Group had been very active and I am very pleased to say I was able to help with their fund raising and in fact faised £500 for them over the year. We have not had an active sports season, but perhaps this can be improved upon.

The C.C. is a mixture of our younger and older members and the meetings are very productive and enjoyable. We prove that we can get a lot done in a nice, friendly, humorous way.


