DISCOVERING LONDON'S JEWISH DEAF HISTORY

During lockdown, Ann Clements started sorting old photos. From this the idea for the Jewish Deaf History project began. Read how it all came together.

Ann Clements writes:

During the lockdown in 2020, I decided to sort out boxes of hundreds and hundreds of photos that were lying around in my cupboards at home. The photos belonged to my late parents, Rene and Myer Kosky, my late husband Harvey, as well as his family, Polly, Frank, Ivan, Jane and Emil Stryker. That was a huge project!

At the same time, Barry David was sorting out his uncle Harold Fallman's huge piles of old photos and videos including ones from JDA and RSJDC* from the 1920s onwards. He came up with the idea of setting up a Facebook page and a JDA website to share all these valuable photos and videos.

Barry and I sorted these into categories: JDA, RSJDC, WOJD** and Jewish Deaf Sports. Then I sorted these into year groups, and added them to photo albums, which took a total of three months. A fantastic achievement!

The next stage of the project started - looking into the huge pile of old silent films that had filled a whole wardrobe! Many were taken at the RSJDC and JDA, as well as at family events. I had these converted to digital files and the quality was fantastic! So many memories to cherish.

Several Deaf members, including Miriam Solomon and Martin Binysh, kindly helped us with identifying and naming all the people in the photos and videos, especially all the current living members who are now in their 70's, 80's, and 90's.

They all have such brilliant memories to recognise so many people! There are too many names to mention, but a BIG thank you to each one of you!

The most valuable archives are the old silent films as they showed older and different signs in BSL that are slowly being phased out. These will eventually be shown on the new Jewish Deaf History website.
