Remembering Kay Bieber

ay Bieber passed away at Northampton General Hospital on 16th August 2020 following complications from a hernia operation.

Kay was born in Liverpool in 1937. When she was 9 years old she attended the Royal Liverpool School for the Deaf. She was a weekly boarder.

At the age of 16 years, she left school and found employment at the Crawford's biscuit factory.

At the age of 21 years, Kay moved with her mum from Liverpool to London. It was a new start for both of them. Shortly after, Kay joined Shepherds Bush deaf club and regularly attended for 4 years until Kay was advised by her mum's friend that she should join a lovely Jewish deaf club, the JDA located at Cazenove Road in Stoke Newington. It was there that Kay met her husband Leslie in 1962 and a beautiful courtship blossomed.

Kay married Leslie on 9 October 1966 at St John's Wood Synagogue. They were regular members of JDA and would visit regularly at Cazenove Road.

Kay loved to travel with her family and visited some lovely parts of the world including New York and for her Golden Wedding Anniversary she and her husband Leslie travelled to Sydney and Melbourne in Australia.

After JDA moved to North Finchley, Kay still visited with Leslie despite the distance from Northampton and would stay at the Glenlyn Hotel next door to JDA. Kay was a life long member of JDA.

Kay will be sorely missed by all the JDA members that remember her: Kenneth and Lorraine Silver, Harold Fallman, Alan and Colleen Daniels to name just a few.

Kay leaves behind her doting husband Leslie of 53 years and two lovely children, Rosalind and Victor, both of whom were regular visitors to the JDA at Cazenove Road during the 1970's and 80's. Kay also leaves behind her grandson Nicholas, son of Rosalind, Kay's only grandchild. She had a wonderful close bond with her family.
